Lesson:



- Rebellion/Resistance comes in many forms. The children will study how music and dance can be used as a sign of resistance. For the people of Puerto Rico, singing their national anthem "La Borinqueña" and dancing "La Bomba" were perceived as signs of resistance. Explain to the children, that the people raised their voices against the way foreign invaders treated them in artistic ways.
- Play the video: ¿Dónde Está El Coquí? Ask the students: Why the coqui makes noise?
- Play the Puerto Rican Anthem. La Borinqueña (Westside Story Version) or La Borinqueña (Acoustic Version)
- Ask the children their thoughts on the music. Does the music remind them of anything? Can they connect with it?
- Now you will watch and then practice "La Bomba". Explain to the children that "La Bomba" is a dance brought over from Africa by enslaved people. The dance is an important part of the LatinX culture and a form of rebellion and today, they will learn how to dance "La Bomba". Play a clip from Alma's Way to prep the children for the dance. Choose from Alma's Way or La Bomba Dance @ 4:40)



Cultural Dancing Activity (10-15 minutes)

Play the Bomba tutorial La Bamba Dance Tutorial. Allow students to orderly move about the room and follow along with the tutorial.

Closing Community Circle (5-10 minutes)

In the final minutes allow participants to share their thoughts on today's lesson.
